

### Introduction

Academic and Career Planning, or ACP, is a student-driven, adult supported process in which students create and cultivate their own unique and information-based visions for post secondary success, obtained through self-exploration, career exploration, and the development of career management and planning skills. ACP was embedded into the E4E (Education for Employment) statute during the 2017-18 academic year. ACP is required for students in grades 6-12 and is intended to assist them with planning and preparing for postsecondary opportunities. E4E can also be referred to as "PI26."

- Develop individual goals
- Prepare a personal plan for achieving their vision and goals

### **Career Readiness Success Stories**

### STUDENT SUCCESS STORIES

As part of the state accountability system, the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) produces report cards for every district and school in Wisconsin. In 2022-2023, Lake Country School scored 91.3 & 5 Stars - Significantly Exceeds Expectations. In the area of **ACHIEVEMENT**, students scored 97.7 (95.4 in ELA and 100 in Math). Achievement scores are a student's level of knowledge and skills attained compared against **state academic standards** in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics.

Fifth grade students participated in Biz Town through Junior Achievement.

Eighth grade students participated in the Health Careers Expo hosted by Waukesha Business Alliance.

# ACP/School Counseling Services

School Counselor teaches personal, social and academic skills in Guidance classes, including Xello lessons. Students in 5K-6th grade receive Guidance classes once a week for the school year. Students in 7-8th grade receive Guidance classes once a week for a semester. Results from Xello lessons are stored in the student's ACP portfolio as part of the ACP Conferences.

# Whole School Support

- Students participate in multiple career conversations to discuss their career interests, academic goals, and postsecondary plans with their teachers at multiple grade levels
- Teachers in all subject areas help students in their classes understand how the content they are learning connects with various careers and career readiness skills

### INDIVIDUALIZED ACP SUPPORT

- Encourage students to meet rigorous & relevant academic standards
- Facilitate academic, personal and social lessons to establish and maintain supportive relationships
- Monitor student course work grades/success
- Monitor 6-8th grade student progress on grade level Xello lessons and assessments
- Contact families of all students as needed to share student success/concerns

# **ACCESS FOR ALL STUDENTS**

If a pupil is a child with a disability, the pupil's academic and career plan shall be made available to the pupil's individual education program team. The pupil's individualized education program team may, if appropriate, take the pupil's academic and career plan into account when developing the pupil's transition services.

Students with IEPs will have their case workers assigned as their Academic Advisors to ensure ACP goals match IEP transition and educational goals. Case workers may also serve as Career Advisors if determined the most appropriate fit.

#### CAREER READINESS TECHNOLOGY

All of our K-8 feeder schools utilize XELLO as the main learning platform for career exploration. Many of our feeder schools use vaview.net for the elementary age children to explore careers.

XELLO is the Wisconsin selected (subscription is paid by the state) vender used provide access to an ACP software tool that allows students to engaged in career exploration, planning and preparation online. Within Xello, students have access to a variety of interest and ability surveys, career and college exploration tools, and a specific area (About Me) to build their electronic portfolio. Lake Country School has opted to use Xello for all students in grades 6-8; students can access Xello at any time on their own but will be specifically directed to do so during set classes and advising sessions over the course of their MS careers.

## **Get Involved**

### **FAMILY ENGAGEMENT**

The School District of Lake Country School engages families and caregivers in academic and career planning by:

Advisors are encouraged to reach out to families of students they advise if/when a need or concern should arise. However, families are encouraged to contact their child's advisor at any time. The advisor can also serve to facilitate communication between the family and other teachers as necessary.

Conferences: Parent-Teacher Conferences: All families are invited to attend parent-teacher conferences at all grade levels twice a year; October and February. Families of students in grade 9 will be scheduled for an October advising conference with their child's Academic Advisor.

Individual Student Planning Conferences: All families are invited to attend their child's individual student planning conference held with the school counselor during the sophomore, junior and senior years.

Xello Parent & Guardian Accounts: All parents or guardians of students in grades 6-8 can create a Xello account to monitor their child's progress in this online career exploration platform. Parents or guardians can contact the school counselor to have an account created for them.
